MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

Welcome to the Air Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (AFJROTC) Program. This document serves as a mutual agreement between all involved parties: the AFJROTC staff, cadets, and their parent(s) or guardian(s). To participate in the program, both the cadet and their parent or guardian must sign this document, signifying their commitment to the program's expectations.

JROTC Instructors are **NOT** Military Recruiters. We can't force anyone to enlist; this takes months of commitment that only a qualified Military Recruiter can guide you through. Cadets cannot be drafted into any Military service.

Standards of Conduct

Integrity: Maintain the highest level of honesty: never lie, cheat, or steal.

Respect: Always show respect to school faculty, staff, fellow cadets, and other students.

Disobedience: Disrespectful language, or inappropriate gestures will not be tolerated.

Community Service: Each cadet *must* complete **16 hours** of community service by the end of the school year. Opportunities will be provided each quarter to help cadets achieve this goal.

Extracurricular Activities: Participation in leadership and team-building activities is strongly encouraged. Available activities include (See activity descriptions on final page):

1. Fitness Team (Raiders)
2. Drill Teams: Armed Exhibition, Unarmed Exhibition, Exhibition, Inspection
3. STEM Teams: Drones, Robotics, Rocketry

Substance-Free: Refrain from using illegal drugs and alcohol.

Inclusion: Show respect for everyone, regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, socioeconomic status, documentation status, disability, culture, experiences, learning style, or knowledge.

Bullying: The AFJROTC Program has a zero-tolerance policy for bullying. No student should intimidate, harass, or bully another student, *whether in person or online*. This includes physical contact, verbal assaults, and social isolation or manipulation.

Compliance: Follow all school and county regulations.

Grooming: Adhere to the grooming standards outlined in the Cadet Handbook.

Uniforms: Uniforms are provided at no cost; however, cadets are responsible for replacing any lost or damaged items.

Uniform Wear & Authorization: Uniforms must be worn once each week on designated days, for the entire school day. Uniforms should only be worn when authorized by an AFJROTC instructor, whether in or out of school.

Additional Expectations: **Cadets must follow all AFJROTC directives and exercise common sense.** We are thrilled to welcome you to the AFJROTC Program and are committed to helping you grow into a disciplined and capable leader.
